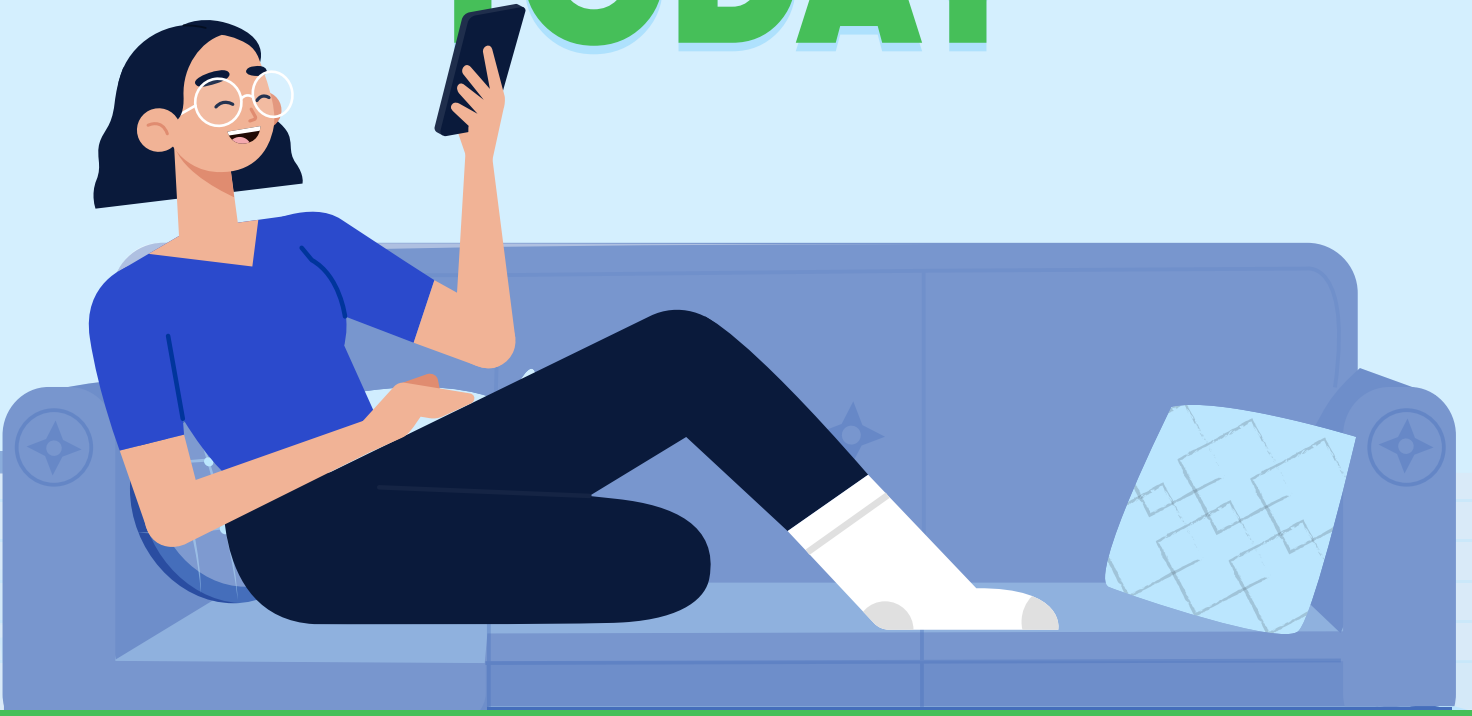


6 TIPS to Improve Your AIR QUALITY TODAY

Everything from cleaning supplies and paints to furnishings and electronics can have an impact on indoor air quality. Look for products with low volatile organic compound (VOC) levels.

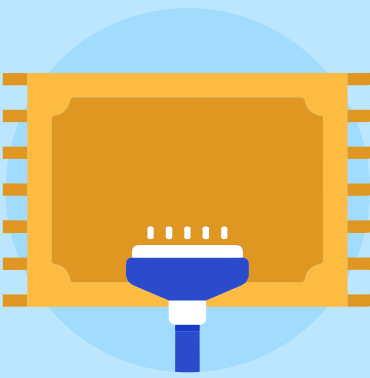


3 Address Moisture Issues in Your Home

Mold and mildew love damp environments, so check regularly for leaks or condensation and address problems as soon as they occur. Invest in a dehumidifier if needed.

4 Change Furnace Filters Regularly

Changing furnace filters is an inexpensive way to improve indoor air quality. However, replacing your furnace filter every one to three months prevents debris from entering indoor spaces through heating and cooling systems. If you live in a space with pets or smokers, changing your furnace filter more frequently may be necessary.



5 Steam Clean Your Carpets

Carpets trap dirt, dust mites, and pet dander deep within their fibers. For best results, have a professional come in annually to steam clean your carpets to remove this buildup and help improve the indoor air quality at home.

6 Use HEPA filters on your vacuum cleaner

Regular vacuum cleaners spread dirt and dust into the air as they clean, but heavy-duty models with HEPA filters will keep most of that dust inside the vacuum bag where it belongs.
